Position Overview

Support the Executive Director in management and development of organization filings at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. The Director will also assist with member interaction and education, particularly focusing on commission staff, to execute the needs of the organization as established by the Executive Committee and Board of Directors. Duties and Responsibilities

- Work with member commission staff to develop organization positions and facilitate information exchange; lead meetings, follow projects and open issues
- Provide legal support for organization
- Follow FERC filings and identify items for consideration by internal work groups and Board of Directors for OMS involvement
- Draft documents communicating organization positions
- Represent the organization among various industry stakeholders (e.g., NARUC, MARC, SERUC, ERSC)
- Stay current on industry news and developments
- Travel averaging 3-8 days per month
