Dear Ms. Boegeman,

Thank you for your request for OMS input to next year's MISO Transmission Expansion Plan.

The OMS continues to support the Long-Range Transmission Planning study that is underway and believes it should remain MISO's primary focus in the coming year. State regulators have been active participants in the process thus far and we continue to encourage our members to provide as much information as possible to ensure state resource plans are accurately reflected.

The OMS principles on Long-Range Transmission Planning stress the importance of moving forward in a timely manner and we believe recent extreme weather events and the 2022 planning resource auction results should motivate MISO to focus on those aspects of the LRTP that yield the most sizable economic and reliability benefits. To this end, the OMS respectfully suggests that analysis of addressing the North-South constraint should be prioritized.

We look forward to continuing our work with MISO staff and stakeholders on this important effort. The OMS does not have any additional feedback on the scope of MTEP23 at this time.
